

REGULAR SEMI-MONTHLY MEETING
CORDOVA POLICE PROTECTION COMMITTEE

Julia Pannier called the semi-monthly meeting of the Cordova Police Protection Committee to order at 7:00 P.M., in the Cordova Township Office.

A question and answer period followed with points noted in regard to duties already being performed and areas that both Village and Township would like to see implemented.

At present there are 2 full time police officers and 4 part time, however there are three covering most of the time. The Township and Village are covered on a 24 hour basis – 80 hours per week being covered by two officers and the balance being covered by the County and State. Police Chief Lambert on call at all times.

Each officer works a ten hour shift and travels approximately 100 to 150 miles. Keeps track of time beyond schedule.

Two squad cars in good condition

Patrolling of Township roads: officer on duty fills out a patrol sheet showing the times they check areas such as Neumiller Farms, cemetery, Civic Center etc.

Question of Civic Center Park closure. Park sign says closed from 10 P.M. until sunrise. Supervisor and Road Commissioner will discuss and give guide lines to officers.

Question of no one being notified of recent incident at the Civic Center. All people concerned will be notified that any irregularity must be reported at once, to the police department and/or the supervisor so appropriate action can be taken.

Police department asked to make an appearance – scan parking lot during activities at the civic center, also check doors for security after event is over. Keys for the gate will be provided.

Police department will have a report for the August Township newsletter.

Explanation of fine disposition: of a \$75.00 fine, \$36.00 goes to the Village, balance to court, etc. Village money goes into general police fund for the following year, cannot be used for budgeting purposes.

Drag strip: Police chief works for the Drag strip on his own time. Two other officers on duty during this time; they may call him for back up if needed and he will

respond. Drag strip employs their own security system. State and County officers help Cordova department with traffic exiting park.

Question if police chief can wear uniform during work hours at drag strip. Is the Village liable if he is injured? Would he present a more authoritative figure if in uniform?

Drag strip request to have more patrolling on the back roads of the track during times of admission.

Drag strip owners will meet Thursday, August 9, 2001 with police department.

Police Chief Lambert explained squad car being out of the Township – only to conduct business in surrounding areas.

Meeting adjourned at 8:05 P.M.
